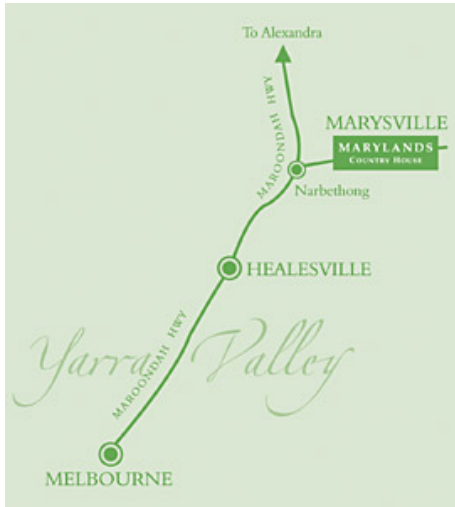

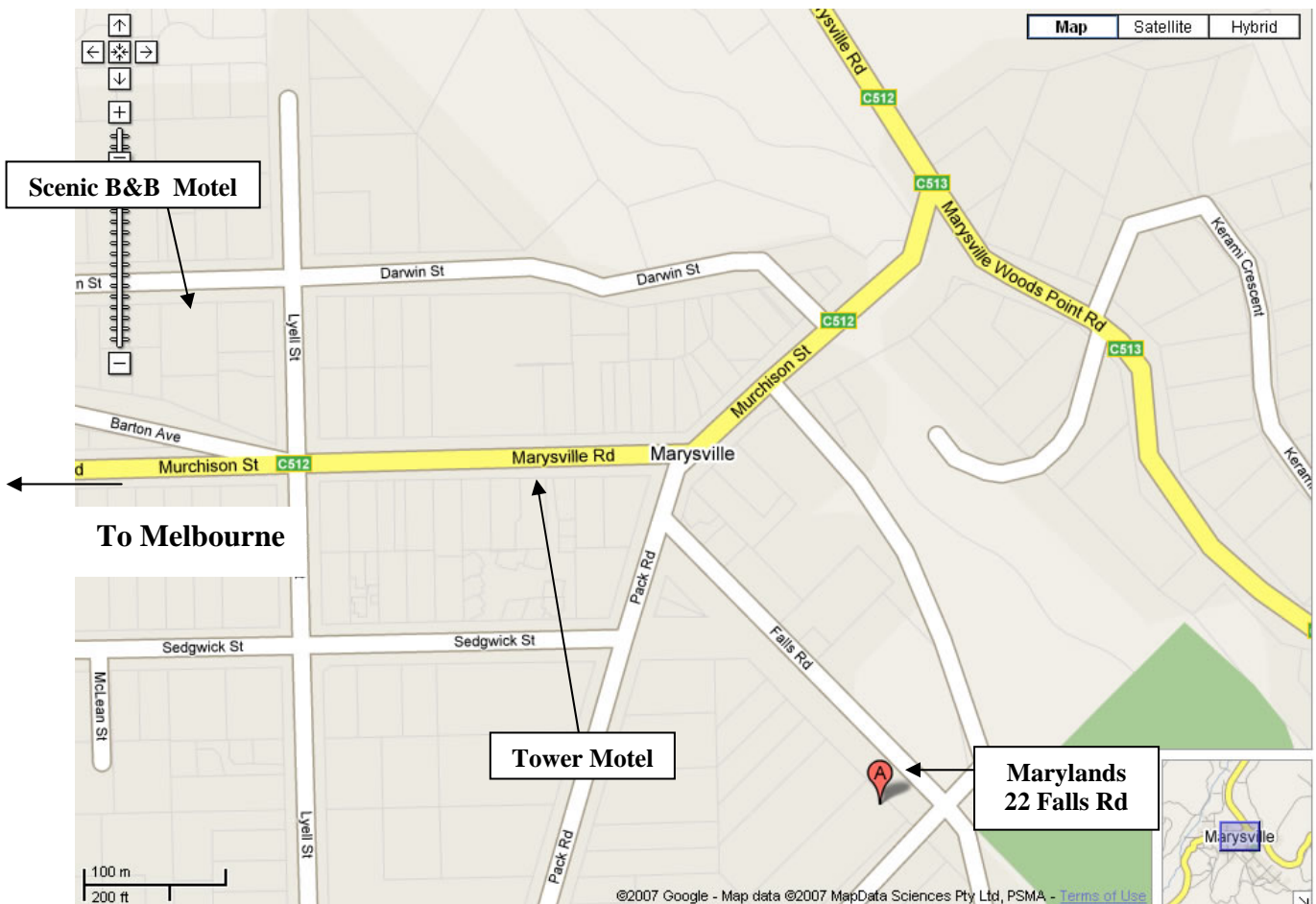
How to get to Marysville:



Nestled alongside the renowned Yarra Valley, Marylands is an enjoyable 90 minute drive from Melbourne.

Take the **Maroondah Highway** out of Melbourne into the Yarra Valley . Stay on the Maroondah Highway and head up into the ranges passing through **Healesville**. You will be driving on one of Victoria's Great Roads and will see some of the finest mountain forest in Australia. At **Narbethong**, turn right and you will be just ten minutes from Marysville. When you arrive in Marysville, drive along the main street, and turn right into **Pack Road** then left into **Falls Road** (this is the road to Stevenson Falls and is well sign posted).

Marylands is about 100 metres along Falls Road on the right hand side (opposite the sports oval).



Doctoral Presentations:

Doctoral presentations have been scheduled on both days of the conference. In addition to presenting their own paper, all doctoral students are expected to attend the presentations of their fellow students and to participate in the discussion following each talk. All academic staff are also encouraged to attend the presentations at some stage during the conference and to provide feedback and comments.

Audience members are kindly requested to treat the presenters as they themselves would wish to be treated as a presenter. For example, please remain seated during presentations, and comments/questions should be constructive not destructive. Audience members are also requested not to enter/exit the room during presentations.

Each presentation is to be of no more than 20 minutes duration followed by no more than 10 minutes of discussion. Presentations will be timed and terminated precisely at the 20 minute mark.

A panel of academic staff will assess each presentation according to the following criteria:

1. Evaluation and integration of existing literature
2. Clearly explained motivation for conducting research
3. Clearly stated aims and research questions
4. Clearly described research design/methodology
5. Expected contributions of research to field
6. Ability to use clear, simple English with limited jargon.
7. Ability to respond appropriately to questions
8. Presentation delivered effectively within allocated time
9. Overall quality of powerpoint presentation

Prizes will be given for the best papers and presentations.

While the setting for the presentations is an informal one, students should view these presentations as an important stage in the development of their research projects.
